Following the amalgamation of the Nambour and Sunshine Coast Districts, she continued her service in many roles including as an integral member of the District Match Committee. Mavis was also awarded Life Membership of Sunshine Coast District Ladies Association and in 2022 served as their President until the Mens and Ladies District Associations amalgamated. RIP Mavis.



## **Snapshot – Second Green Challenge**

The following story featured on the front page of the Nambour Chronicle dated 26<sup>th</sup> July 1946.

Presenting his presidential report to the  $11^{\rm th}$  annual meeting of the Nambour Bowling Club on Wednesday evening, Mr J Bentley stated that the No. 2 green was now in an advanced stage of construction, and to date it had cost approximately £1300. Magnitude of the work involved, he said, could be gauged by the fact that 1500 yards of material was used.

The task has been an arduous one and in view of the difficulties which had to be surmounted this committee is to be complimented upon their work.

#### Flashback - New Clubhouse 1953



Many members may be unaware of the history of the current clubhouse. The original small building was erected near the creek bank shortly after the club was formed in 1932 but by the 1950s a major upgrade was needed to meet growing membership and demand.

The following article from the Nambour Chronicle on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> November 1953 covered the official opening. The building at that time looked similar to the above image and in the following decade the clubhouse was extended further towards the green. Today the extension can be detected from the outside by way of the flat roofed section.

# £4470 BOWLS CLUB HOUSE OPENED Nambour's Gala Day Netts £200

Saturday last was a gala and historic day for the Nambour Bowling Club for it marked the official opening of the new £4470 club house. The afternoon's proceedings were eminently successful, the club collecting a rain insurance of £100 when it insured for 10 points and 21 points fell. Rain did not mar the proceedings or diminish the crowd, being in the vicinity of 4100. The evening was also successful, but the club missed out on insurance. Profits on the day aggregated £200
